#### THE SECOND LOCKDOWN

On Monday, December 14, the Dutch government announced a second lockdown until at least January 19, 2021. The restrictions imposed, force us to provide all education online once more, for at least the entire third period of this academic year. The first lockdown has taught us that there is an awful lot of information on how to teach online - often found in many places - which sometimes makes it difficult to find exactly what you as teaching staff need.
